Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Stamp: Over the Moon (149331)

Cardstocks: Whisper White (100730), Old Olive (100702), So Saffron (105118)

Punch: Twinkle Builder (146321)

Die: Stitched Shapes Dies (152323)

Ink: Memento Tuxedo Black (132708), Old Olive (147090)

Blends Markers: Old Olive Light (144574), Lovely Lipstick Dark (147028), Smoky Slate Light (145054), Basic Black Light (147940), Crumb Cake Light (144582), Crumb Cake Dark (144581), Petal Pink Light (146866), Bronze (144607), Soft Suede Light (146874), Daffodil Delight Light (144586)

Misc: Wink of Stella Glitter Brush (141897), Paper Snips (103579), Paper Trimmer (152392), Bone Folder (102300), Die Cutting Machine, Silver Sequins

Adhesives: Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332)

Cutting Measurements:

Whisper White Card base: 5 1/2" x 8 1/2" – scored at 4 1/4"

Old Olive Layer: 5 1/4" x 4"

Whisper White Stamped layer: 5 1/8" x 3 7/8"

Instructions:

1. Stamp the grass using Old Olive ink onto the White layer and adhere to the Old Olive layer – then adhere both to the card base
2. Stamp the cows onto scraps of White cardstock and use Stampin' Blends Markers in the colors of your choice to color them in – then them out cut and use Dimensionals to attach them to the card
3. Stamp the sentiment 'Party 'til the cows come home' onto a scrap of White cardstock and cut out using the small circle die from Stitched Shapes Dies – alternatively you can stamp it directly onto the White layer
4. Stamp the moon onto the White layer and color in
5. Punch out a small yellow star from So Saffron cardstock and use a glue dot to adhere in place
6. Dot around some Silver Sequins or Rhinestone Jewels and your cute card is ready for giving ☺
